


New Marston Primary School

<p><u>English</u> As Authors, we will use the fascinating book 'Wonder Struck' by Brian Selznick to explore how meaning is created through imagery, as well as study the effectiveness of the author's techniques and writing style. Focusing on the theme of wolves presented in the book, we will conduct our own research about the animals and then produce a non chronological report about this species from the dog family.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> As Mathematicians, we will develop our fluency, reasoning and problem-solving skills. In particular, we will begin with a focus on decimals, fractions and percentages before moving on to perimeter, area and statistics.</p>	<p><u>Computing</u> As Computer Programmers, we will learn about computer programming and algorithms. We will be using the program 'Purple Mash' to design, code and create our own games.</p>
<p><u>Humanities</u> As Geographers, we will develop our knowledge of Asian countries and cities. We will first look at the natural and human geography of key places on the continent. We will explore the concepts of light, dark and shadow by creating silhouettes on a sunset background and explore using different media such as charcoal, pastels and watercolours.</p>

We will use our collaborative thinking skills to understand money, savings and financial education.</p>		<p><u>Science</u> As Scientists, we will begin with STEM week. Our theme is sustainability and we will be set a challenge for the week.
